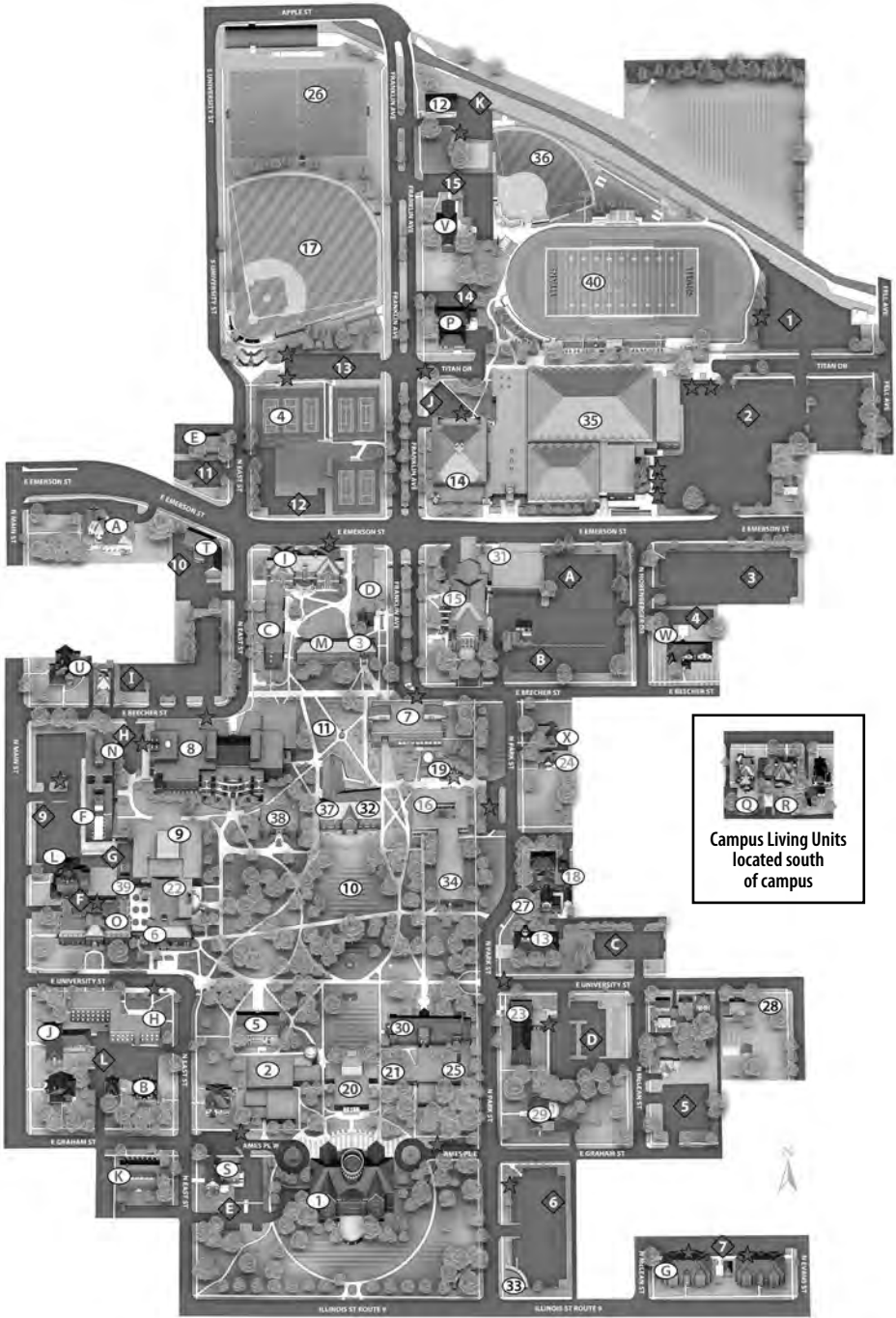
Campus Visit
