- Complete both BIOL 161 & BIOL 162 with a C or better to be equivalent to IWU 101 & 102
- Complete both CHEM 161 & CHEM 162 with a C or better to be equivalent to IWU 201 & 202
- Pre-medical Students: Pre-medical students are advised to take either HCC Introduction to Psychology (PSY 101) or IWU General Psychology (PSYC 100) before taking the Medical College Admissions Test. Similarly, Pre-medical students should take either HCC Sociology (SOC 101) or IWU Sociology.
- Both 212 and 216 should be completed by the end of the junior year; ideally during the fall semester if possible.
- Six additional courses are required at the 300 or 400 -level. Courses should be selected to meet the following criteria for the degree: one course in each of the bolded topics above plus additional major electives to complete the six courses. At least one course should meet the writing intensive requirement.
- Students are encouraged to work with their advisor in order to select appropriate courses to meet these requirements. A possible course pattern is provided.

- **COMM 101:** The COMM 101 course does not fulfill any IWU requirements. Students who plan to complete the GECC, plan to transfer IWU courses back to HCC for completion of the Associate's in Arts Degree, or who plan to pursue the Pharm. D. degree after the bachelor's degree, should take COMM 101. (Pharmacy schools require a speech course.) Students who plan to complete the IWU General Education program may wish to opt out of COMM 101.
- Flexibility in Course Sequencing: Some students may feel more comfortable taking CHEM 161/162 in their first year at HCC and BIOL 161/162 and CHEM 241/242 in their second year at HCC.
- Remedial math courses may be needed to prepare for MATH 161. However, remedial courses will not transfer to IWU. College Algebra, College Trigonometry and Precalculus will not transfer to IWU. Adjust schedule and semester hour requirement accordingly to complete degree.
- To meet IWU graduation requirements choose one course from each group. 1 US Diversity (CHLD 207, Film 211, HIST 135, 136, 210, MUSI 260, POS 101, SOC 110, SOC 135, or SOC 221) and 1 Global Diversity (ANTH 101, HIST 150, HUMA 210, HUMA 270, MUSI 160, POS 151, JAPN 202, SPAN 202) while at Heartland.
- AP scores of 3, 4, or 5 and Standard level IB scores of 5 or higher will receive 1 unit of credit.
- The IWU Second Language requirement can be met by completing the intermediate level (201) course of any language or by earning a 4 or 5 on the AP exam in a second language. - Students should complete a minimum of 64 semester hours, not including remedial or PE courses, at HCC to be on track to complete their bachelor's degree in a total of 4 years.
- Students are required, at minimum, to complete 16 units of coursework at IWU including half of all major requirements.
- IWU graduation requirements: 32 total courses and 32 total units with 9 courses and 9 units of upper level (300/400) courses. (1 IWU unit = 4 semester hours)
